

The Dublin GAA Crest Fact File

What does the crest symbolise?

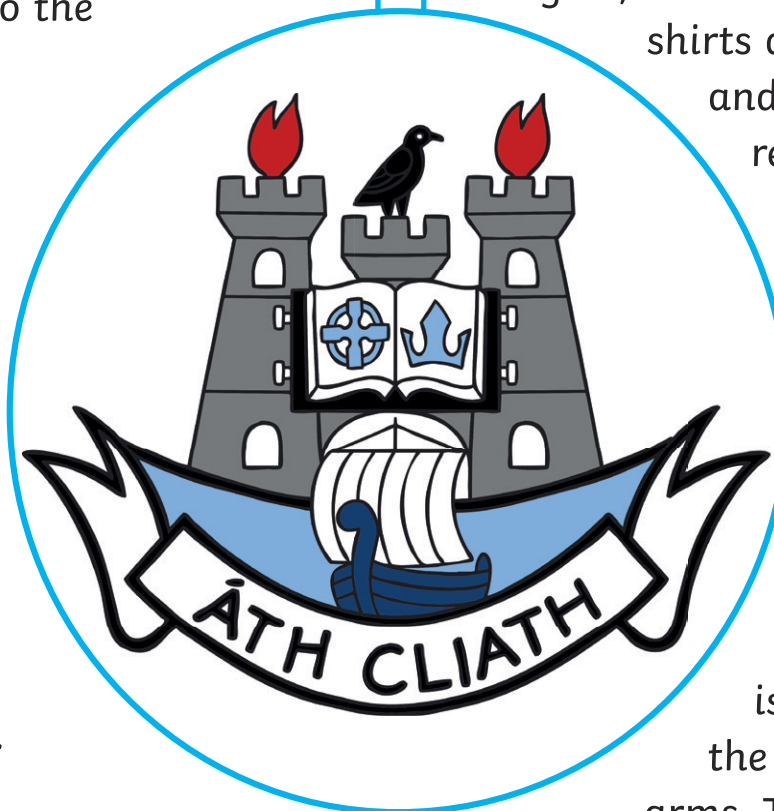
The castle in flames signifies the city of Dublin and pays homage to the Dublin coat of arms.

The raven represents the county of Fingal.

The book (St. Tamlacht (Tallaght) manuscript), represents the county of South Dublin.

The Viking longboat represents the county of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown.

The title, Áth Cliath, appear on the crest. This is the gaelic name for Dublin.



Today, the new Dublin crest appears on all Dublin GAA gear, including its shorts, shirts and hats, and is a widely recognised around the world.



The Dublin crest, that can be found on the Dublin jersey today, is a version of the Dublin coat of arms. This has been an emblem for the city of Dublin for over 400 years.
