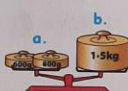



### Wednesday

- What is the cost of 4kg of pick and mix sweets at €2.50 per  $\frac{1}{2}$  kg? €20
- Circle the number nearer to 1,000.

unlikely (likely, unlikely, certain)
  - What is the cost of 10kg of potatoes at €1.20 per 2kg? €6
  - $0.6 + 0.06 + 6 + 60 = 66.66$
  - $10 - 1.1 = 8.9$
  - Share €2.40 among 3 people.  
Each person gets 80c.
